
1) New EDST courses

APPENDIX B: Program Requirements

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

<u>Note</u>: Major/Minor courses may only count for Major or Minor credit towards one Major or Minor. <u>Note</u>: Courses taken for a B.A. (Educational Studies) do not lead to teacher certification.

HONOURS BA: 120 Credits

Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 course credits, and at least half (50 percent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor, must be taken at York University.

Graduation Requirement: All graduates must complete a total of at least 120 credits, with a minimum overall cumulative grade point average of 5.00 (C+)

General Education: All graduates must complete a total of 21.00 credits general education courses. These include: Humanities course (AP/HUMA), a Social Science course (AP/SOSC), and a Natural Science course (SC/NATS).

- 6.00 credits in Natural Science (NATS)
- 9.00 credits approved general education course in the social science (SOSC) or humanities (HUMA) categories.
- 6.00 credits approved general education course in the opposite category to the 9.00 credit course in social science (SOSC) or humanities (HUMA) already taken.

It is strongly recommended that students complete the general education requirements within their first 54 credits.

Free Choice Electives: 15 credits without code EDST

Courses Outside the Faculty of Education. Students must complete 42 credits (BA courses) outside of Educational Studies EDST and the Faculty of Education. 12 credits are required at the 4000 level.

HONOURS DOUBLE MAJOR BA

Educational Studies may be pursued jointly with any other Honours Bachelor of Arts Degree program or with a Bachelor of Social Work.*

*Note: In a double major program, a course may count only once toward major credit.

Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 course credits, and at least half (50 percent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor, must be taken at York University.

Graduation Requirement: All graduates must complete a total of at least 120 credits, with a minimum overall cumulative grade point average of 5.00 (C+)

General Education: All graduates must complete a total of 21.00 credits general education courses. These

include: Humanities course (AP/HUMA), a Social Science course (AP/SOSC), and a Natural Science course (SC/NATS).

- 6.00 credits in Natural Science (NATS)
- 9.00 credits approved general education course in the social science (SOSC) or humanities (HUMA) categories.
- 6.00 credits approved general education course in the opposite category to the 9.00 credit course in social science (SOSC) or humanities (HUMA) already taken.
