Supervision of graduate students may be available for qualified candidates. The projected start date for this position is July 1, 2019. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

A doctorate in Early Childhood Education or a related field, and experience in teacher education in the area of early childhood education are required for the position. The successful candidate must be able to provide documented evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching and demonstrate commitment to pedagogy with the potential for programmatic leadership. Pedagogical innovation in one or more high priority areas such as early years education policy; child development; mathematics, literacy, and/or the arts in primary education; family literacy; and play is required. Teaching experience in K to 12 schools (or equivalent), and a record of publishing in professional journals, speaking at professional conferences, and offering workshops are highly desirable.
