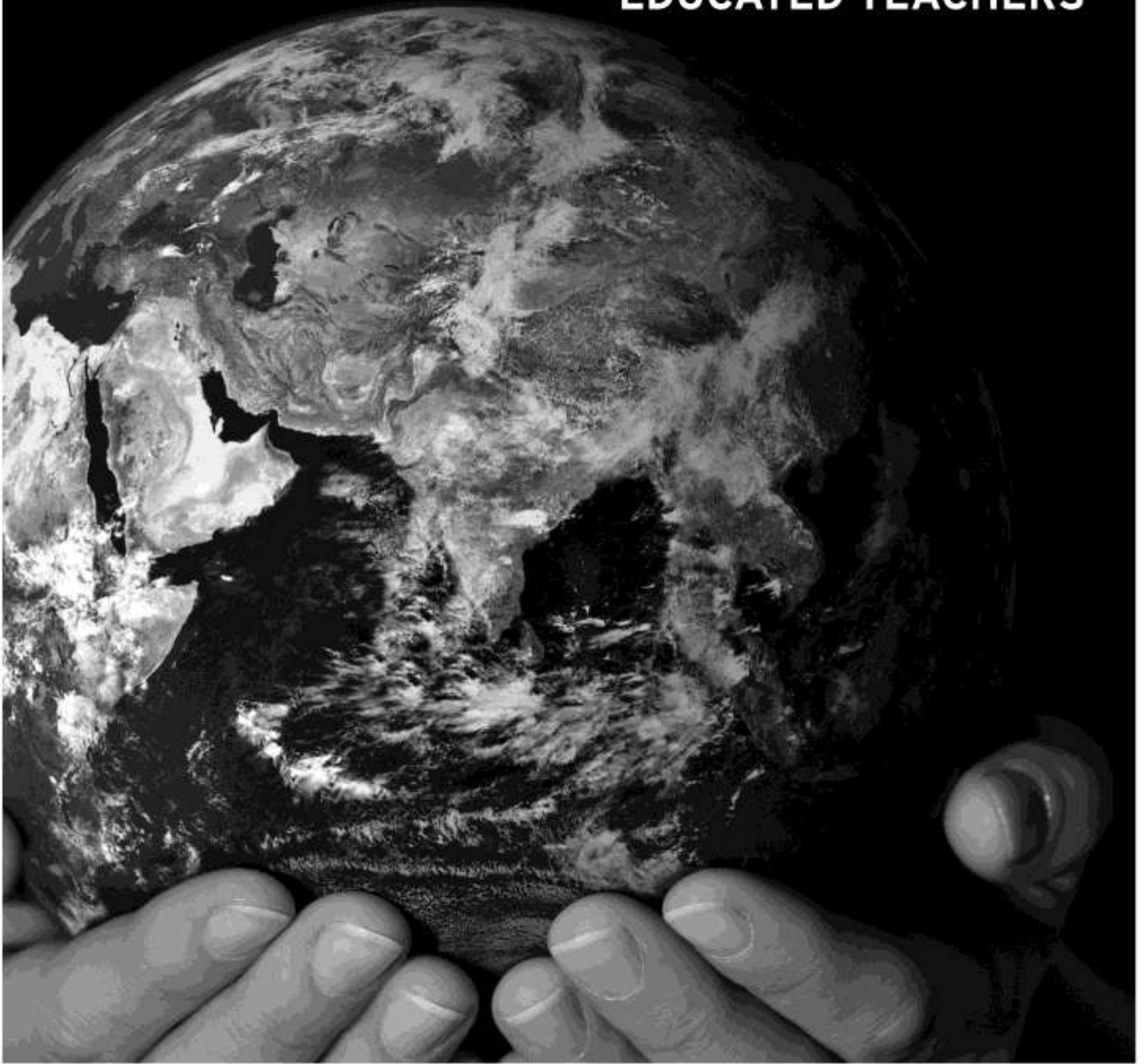

Information for Internationally Educated Teachers

The following three options are available for Internationally Educated Teachers. An individual may wish to pursue one or more of these options.

Additional Qualification courses

Additional Qualification programs operate on a "recommended/not recommended" basis. Grades will not be assigned. Programs do not carry degree credit and will not appear on York University transcripts.

Once you have successfully completed a course, your Ontario College of Teachers record will be updated through the Office of Research and Professional Development. AQ and ABQ courses are offered in Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer sessions. Courses are 125 hours, including a 25-hour independent project component, and offered online, partially online or face to face. Courses in a faculty of Education

A full course is 6 credits and generally runs September – April. A half course is 3 credits and runs either September – December or January – April.

For undergraduate sessional dates, go to <http://www.registrar.yorku.ca/enrol/dates/>.

In order to register in time for courses, your information must be submitted by September 16 for the Fall term and January 6 for the Winter term.

Internationally educated teachers will be registered as 'Special Students' in courses where space permits, once registration of full-time students has been completed for the given term. In addition to course fees, a \$30 processing fee is required prior to course enrolment (money order only).

Education Practicum

Your 20- or 40-day practicum placement must be in the Division for which the College of Teachers has granted/is prepared to grant you interim certification.

In order to qualify for the practicum program at York University, you must agree to attend five practicum seminars for each semester, tied to the practicum course PRAC 2100 section I. Attendance is mandatory. The practicum may take place in the following terms: Fall (September-December) or Winter (January-April). A maximum of 25 Special Students are accepted for each term.

A 20-day practicum is considered as a 3-credit course (ED/PRAC 2100 3.00). A 40-day practicum would be considered as (2) 20-day practicum; both Fall AND Winter. In order to be enrolled in the practicum course, and to receive a transcript, your placement arrangements must have been made by September 16 for the Fall and January 6 for the Winter term.

This course focuses on the inclusion of children with exceptionalities in the general education classroom. The approach taken is that it is the right of students and parents to elect placement in a general education placement at their neighbourhood school, and it is the obligation of schools, teachers, and administration to provide an effective placement. As a group, we define inclusion, identify the stakeholders in inclusion, address the roles of the stakeholders, and explore accommodations and modifications.

Analysis of oral reading miscues and the implications of the patterns of oral reading miscues for classroom instruction is the focus of this course. The general theories underlying miscue analysis will be used as the foundation for consideration several different oral reading analysis techniques.

Important Note: If you are enrolling in an Undergraduate course offered by another faculty at York University, do not submit a Course Transaction Form to the Faculty of Education. You will need to use the online Registration & Enrolment Module. In order to use the University's online services (e.g. change course enrolments, view grades, check your own student financial statements, etc.) you will need to set up an online Passport York account. Please visit <http://www.yorku.ca/yorkweb/currentstudents/ppystudents.html> to establish username and password. Once you have established a Passport York login, then you can enrol in York University courses where open spaces are available. Please note that certain courses have spaces available only to students enrolled in that faculty (i.e. Schulich School of Business, Osgoode Hall Law School, Education, Fine Arts, etc.). In order to research the courses offered at York University, visit the Web site for current students <http://www.yorku.ca/yorkweb/cs.htm>, click on the link "Course Timetables". Search by "Subject" and highlight the course code (e.g. EDUC – Education) and click the "Search Courses" button at the bottom of the webpage. You can click on the link for "Fall/Winter 2011-2012 Course Schedule" for each course you would like to consider. This will give you information on the term (i.e. F for Fall, W for Winter, and Y for Full Year) as well as the day (i.e. M for Monday, T for Tuesday, W for Wednesday, R for Thursday, and F for Friday) and time when different sections of the course are offered. PRACTICUM PLACEMENT

The Faculty of Education will arrange for practicum supervision, evaluation, and documentation. A Practicum Supervisor will be appointed to work with you in your practicum placement. The supervisor will contact you at the beginning of your placement and visit at least once during your practicum to consult with your Host Teacher, discuss your progress with you, and indicate whether or not you are demonstrating the necessary elements and characteristics of teaching to be considered successful in the practicum. Towards the end of your practicum, the Practicum Supervisor will formally observe your ability to plan, implement, and support students in engaging with the curriculum; communicate with students and school colleagues. A Summative Practicum Report will be submitted to you and the Faculty of Education. Based on your combined performance in the practicum seminar and at your practicum placement, you will be assigned a Pass/ Fail grade, which will appear on your York University transcript. In order to qualify for the practicum program at York University, you must agree to attend five practicum seminars tied to the practicum course PRAC 2100 section I. Attendance is mandatory. The practicum **may** take place in the following terms: Fall (September-December) or Winter (January-April). A maximum of 25 Special Students are accepted for each term.
